

# City Park Neighbourhood Traffic Review Tuesday, December 9, 2014 7:00 pm - 9:00 pm City Park Collegiate (student commons)

Residents of the City Park neighbourhood are invited to attend a public meeting to review and discuss a draft traffic plan for their area. The meeting will be hosted by the City of Saskatoon, Transportation Division.

On April 10, 2014 City Park residents participated in discussions and identified ideas and solutions to address traffic concerns in their neighbourhood. Based on feedback and information received during this meeting, other sources, traffic counts and existing traffic studies, the Transportation Division has prepared a draft area-wide traffic plan. The meeting on December 9<sup>th</sup> will provide City Park residents, business owners, property owners, local groups and other stakeholders an opportunity to comment on specific traffic adjustments being proposed for this neighbourhood.

Please join us as we discuss the traffic issues that affect you and your neighbourhood.

## SASKATOON ROADS

inter is fast approaching and with that an end to the heavy construction and detour season.

Saskatoon's unprecedented 2014 summer road work is coming to a close, with over \$50 million spent maintaining and repairing more roads than ever before. In fact, we've invested 47% more than the year before. As a result, we have paved approximately 200 lane kilometres of road this construction season, 120 kilometres more than last year This figure far exceeds our target of 178 kilometres for this year. This is a good start and we plan to do even more next year. The citizens of Saskatoon were clear that road conditions were one of their top priorities.

We continue to move forward with the Growing Forward: Shaping Saskatoon plan for Saskatoon. I encourage you to get involved in the community meetings to help shape our city.

A little closer to home, we have the second meeting for City Park's Traffic Review scheduled for Tuesday, December 9th at City Park Collegiate. I hope to see you there and to hear your thoughts on what we can do to improve traffic and pedestrian safety in the neighbourhood we live in.

If you are interested in receiving regular emails from me that include Council agendas and decisions, public service announcements and other civic information, please drop me an email and I can add you to the local neighbourhood database. All email addresses remain confidential and you can ask to be removed at any time.

Rink Chalet' public skate times will be:


